ELECTRIC FUEL PUMPS REPLACEMENT INSTRUCTIONS

TOOLS AND MATERIALS REQUIRED:

- Replacement fuel pump
- Safety Glasses
- Pliers Screwdrivers & hammer
- Fuel line disconnect tools.
- Safety gloves & Rag or shop Towels

REPLACEMENT PROCEDURE

Prepare the Vehicle

- Open the hood and locate the vehicle's fuel pump access panel, typically located under the rear seats or in the trunk area.
- Remove any obstructions or covers blocking access to the fuel pump module.

Depressurize the Fuel Systems
